Dear Counselor Mills and Under Secretary Otero,

I just wanted to give you a quick heads up/update about the very concerning legislation working its way through Nigeria's legislative branch right now. The legislation—which, among other things, would criminally penalize witnessing or participating in a gay marriage ceremony, participating in LGBT advocacy organizations etc—has passed the Senate and is in the House, where it could pass at any time. It would then go to President Jonathan's desk for signature.

I chaired a call this evening with colleagues from AF, DRL, G staff, S/P, and USAID to identify what we've done so far and potential future action we might take. One idea
