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Another perspective on what the US could say on territory, from Daniel Levy. His formulation, below, is written as public remarks that would use the "1967 plus swaps" language in a way that might appeal to the Israeli public. Again, for what it's worth.

We will focus on defining a border in 2011 between Israel and the future Palestinian state—a clear border that will end all the scurrilous accusations against Israel as supposedly being interested in maintaining occupation or in so-called land grabs, or even this talk of apartheid and having one state. Implementing an Israeli-Palestinian border will deal a knockout blow to all this de-legitimization stuff, and it will make the settlements issue a moot point. Delineating a border based on the '67 lines and allowing for one-to-one land swaps will be the focus of our negotiating effort in the coming weeks and months. The urgency is so great that if so required we will put forward our own ideas in this regard and we will secure final and definitive regional and international recognition of that border and of the State of Israel

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
