## **Honduras**

• Tom Shannon credited the Secretary's 40 minute telephone call with Micheletti for turning things around in the negotiations last week. had such a limited vocabulary because she kept repeating "restitution" over and over. The critical fact about the deal that was reached, Tom noted, is that it is now rooted in the Honduran Parliament. It will not all be smooth, but whatever happens it will have the blessing of the key democratic institution. Meanwhile, the Verification Commission will consist of two Hondurans, former Chilean President Lagos and U.S. Secretary of Labor Solis, who will travel to Honduras tomorrow. There are complaints about the agreement from various forces, including Chavez and the Wall Street Journal, but overall it is a real success. We are moving now to release money for monitoring of the November 29 elections and encouraging others to send monitors. The historical significance is that for the first time in Latin America a disruption of government of this sort has been resolved through internal dialogue. It serves as a nice counterpoint to the efforts of Chavez and Ortega to subvert democratic institutions.

## **Bolivia**
