Madam Secretary, given your focus on Baghdad staffing issues, I would like to raise proposals regarding two specific components: 1) Covering the period of Iraqi government formation and summer transition. 2) Selecting Chris Hill's successor.

Iraqi government formation period and summer transition				
The Iraqi government formation process will move into full gear in late March, approximately two weeks after the March 7 elections when the official election results will be certified. Embassy Baghdad (with a large number of Arabic-speaking officers) and USF-I will work with Iraqi leaders to promote the formation of an inclusive cabinet that doesn't cross any U.S. red lines. I propose Washington staffing support for the field as follows:				
In addition, of course, we would have Washington phone calls, strategic communications messaging, diplomatic outreach to Iraq's neighbors and beyond, and VIP visits to help with the government formation process. But I have concentrated on what we would do to augment staffing in the field in ways that I hope will bolster Washington confidence in our efforts.
