(U) The IDF conducted an airstrike on southern Gaza in response to today's attacks, reportedly killing five members of the Popular Resistance Committees.
(U) Israel's Channel 10 reported that IDF helicopters struck at militants north of Eilat. The report speculates that there are more militants at large in Israel's south.
(SBU) The IDF's MSIS clarified the facts of the events in an e-mail to defense attaches:  The attack occurred at 12:09 in the afternoon, with the attackers using light arms and an explosive device (not an anti-tank weapon as previously reported)  2 civilian buses and 2 civilian vehicles were hit. 14 people (including 9 soldiers) were injured in the the first bus, while in the second the driver was killed (there were no passengers)  4 passengers in one of the civilian vehicles were killed, with 1 passenger injured and 1 killed in the second car  A total of 27 were injured and 7 killed today  12:36 members of the Golani Brigade were struck by an IED  12:52 an Israel Police SWAT team engaged with terrorists, killing three
13:32 IDF Combat Engineers completing routine repair work on the border force came under mortar fire 13:39 an anti-tank missile was fired at an IDF combat helicopter
(U) IDF Southern Commander told local media that that in one of the exchanges of fire, two terrorist used small arms, while a third detonated explosives he wore.
(U) IDF Chief of Staff Beni Gantz said in a press conference near the Egyptian border that military search operations continued and confirmed Israeli strikes on Gaza. He stated that Israel believed "the roots" of the terror attack were located in Gaza and that the IDF would continue to operate as necessary. MinDef Ehud Barak spoke with reporters near the scene of today's attack, saying that the IDF will operate with all its force to defend normal life along the border with Egypt. "The IDF is striking at the heads of the committees in the Gaza Strip and if necessary the operation will be expanded," he said.
(U) In comments to Channel 10, a "senior defense official" said that the purpose of the attack was to kidnap and Israeli soldier or civilian in order to bring them to Gaza.
(U) told us that the Erez crossing into Gaza closed at 4 pm and Kerem Shalom closed 30 minutes early. No decision has been made regarding crossing operations for tomorrow.
(U) The Israeli Counter-Terrorism Bureau reissued its travel warning urging Israelis to avoid visiting Sinai and for those already visiting to return to Israel immediately.
(U) Ministry of Defense Director General Udi Shani held a meeting to examine accelerating construction plans for the security fence along the Egyptian-Israeli border.

(U) In a statement, UN SyG strongly condemned today's terror attacks in southern Israel, but "is concerned at the risk of escalation and calls for all to act with restraint."
