As I believe you know, Senator McConnell is leading a delegation of newly elected R Senators (listed below) to Islamabad and Kabul next week. I have had several conversations with the team in Islamabad about their concerns in terms of any planned or unplanned interactions with Pakistanni media while the Senators are there.

Given the highly volatile situation in Islamabad at the moment, and the very challenging media enviroinment in Pakistan, we are doing everything we can to try and prepare them for what they might encounter. However, we all remain concerned that they may not fully appreciate what they will face or how their remarks will be interpreted or, frankly, deliberately misinterpreted.

I'll keep you posted as things move forward. Let me know if you have any other thoughts or suggestions.

Due to the tense political situation over the past few weeks in Pakistan, the Embassy remains concerned about managing the press around the trip given Pakistan's volatile media. SRAP is working on a phone call from Dan Feldman to McConnell's senior foreign policy staffer and will raise the issue. We are also consulting with the embassy to see whether a pre-trip phone call from Munter to McConnell would help to give the traveling party a sense of what they're heading into before they hit the ground. As side note, Amb. Eikenberry will be traveling back to the U.S. and wanted to brief members before their trip but will not arrive until after the CODEL departs.
