Earlier today, following up on our discussion as promised, I sent you a letter outlining our concerns about the proposed new NYC policy limiting foreign security personnel to five weapons, and confirming that this proposal was never approved by either Diplomatic Security or the Secret Service. And reiterating the dangerous conditions this will create overseas from reciprocal action.

Subsequently I have learned that there is a second new proposed policy that you never mentioned in our discussion, nor has anyone on your staff.

It is even more restrictive, giving to NYPD the right to deny any weapons at all solely based on its threat analysis

You can imagine the incredible danger this creates for senior USG official traveling abroad, having to depend solely on the "analysis" of foreign agencies

And it was imposed with no notice and no discussion

What is going on here?
