Deputy Secretary Steinberg chaired.

EAP (DAS Marciel):

-- Thai PM has proposed mid-Nov elections; opposition is studying the idea and has not rejected it. Amb John is urging all parties to work from this proposal. Situation is quiet today.

S/GC (Fried):

-- Two more Guantanamo detainees placed, one in Spain and one in Bulgaria. [redacted]

USUN/W: (Barks-Ruggles)

-- Ahmadinejad spoke only 35 mins; not as "over the top" as other times. Some of his charges may resonate with some NAM countries.

IO (A/S Brimmer):

-- The Secretary laid the ground work for consensus NPT document at her lunch with NAM members yesterday.

SCA: (DAS Krol)

-- In Nepal, Maoist street demonstrations and strike continue. Amb urged Maoists to suspend while negotiations proceed but they refused. Largely peaceful. Embassy remains closed today due to transport problems.

AF: (A/S Carson)

-- in last few weeks, have reports that Sudanese government is [redacted]  
[redacted] Uptick in fighting in Darfur [redacted] A/S Carson delayed his trip to Sudan from this week [redacted] will look at going in June.

-- Looking at possible ministerial on south Sudan in DC around May 26-28.

INL (A/S Johnson):

-- Testifying before drug caucus today, chaired by Sen. Feinstein. Later this month, second round of testimony before McCaskill sub-committee.

-- Planned to travel to Peru next week [redacted]

EUR: (A/S Gordon)

-- Charge in Baku met with presidential advisor; no further word on FSN. Possible call to President Aliyev by the Secretary to discuss possible DC visit by Aliyev.

-- Vice President will visit Brussels later this week; speak to European Parliament and NAC.

-- OSCE IPC today to discuss possible attendance at OSCE Ministerial. [redacted]

-- A/S Gordon will travel to Serbia, Kosovo and Macedonia next week.

WHA (DAS Jacobson):

-- Truth Commission begins in Honduras today. UNASUR still refusing to recognize Honduras; A/S Valenzuela in the region, [redacted]

OES (A/S Jones):

-- Arctic Council senior officials met last week; Russians want to re-organize council, like us; have no specific ideas.
