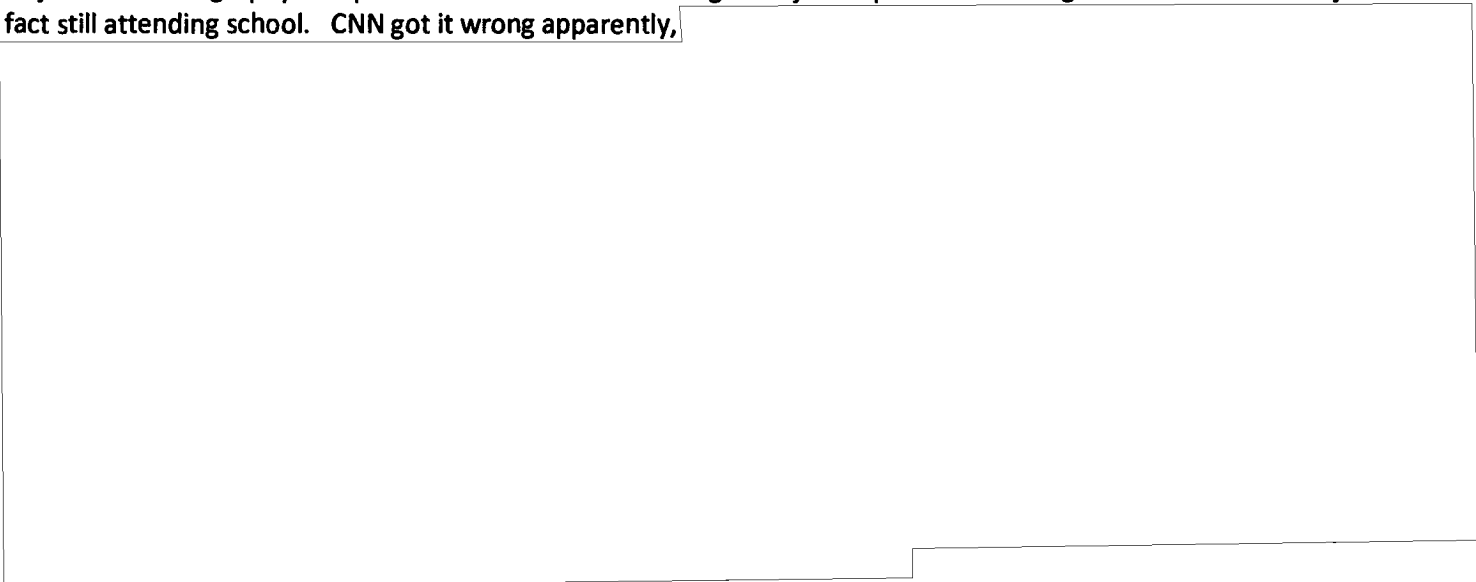

Dear Melanne,

We've been in contact with Salam Alshehri, the project coordinator of the newly launched Entelak school program Glamour helped create for young girls through Sana'a's Girls World Communication Center. She reports that they are in contact with Nujood who is in fact in third grade at a private school. While Nujood isn't in the demographic for the Entelak Project since she's still young enough for public (free) education, she is the role model for the targeted girls. And since Nujood is the spirit of the Project, Salam and her colleagues are thinking of ways to include her in the activities and trainings as much as possible.

We've also spoken to Delphine Minoui, the French reporter who first covered Nujood's case and has since co-written Nujood's autobiography. Delphine has taken on the funding of Nujood's private schooling and confirms that Nujood is in fact still attending school. CNN got it wrong apparently,
