I promised you I'd let you know the very moment I had made a decision on the Humphrey School.

And in what has been the most difficult career decision I have ever confronted, I have decided to accept their offer. It was so difficult because I cannot imagine a more meaningful and fulfilling position than the one I now hold. And I cannot imagine a more inspiring leader than the Secretary – or more support than that which I've received from you, and from others on her senior-level team.

I've always believed deeply that how one leaves a job is as important as how one executes his or her responsibilities while on the job, and I'm committed to ensuring that my transition does not impair the Department's humanitarian (or QDDR) work. To that end, and with the Congressional schedule very much in my mind, I have arranged with the University a mid-October start date, which should give me the chance to bring to closure a number of very important Bureau humanitarian initiatives and, more importantly, should give the Department adequate time to ensure a smooth transition. And I will do everything I possibly can to help you on that front.
