Examples of awardees include Mother Teresa, President Kennedy, Pope John Paul II, Elie Wiesel, Dr. Jonas Salk, Bill Cosby, Vaclav Havel, Isaac Stern, Daniel Patrick Moynihan and Thurgood Marshall. Last year awardees included Stephen Hawking, Senator Kennedy, Sidney Poitier, Billie Jean King and Desmond Tutu, among others.
