First:

Assuring that the national dialogue leading to the implementation of the article from the February 2009 agreement, which states creating constitutional amendments that would result in developing the political and electoral system including the proportional list, which is the right path to guide the country from its current crises.

Second:

assuring that the referendum on the constitutional amendments is conducted first, then to go on with preparations for the parliamentary elections including the proportional list.

Third:

In order to achieve the above, our suggestions are:

- a) The national dialogue approves the reforms resulting in developing the political and electoral system including the proportional list by the end of this year, after that a follow up mechanism is to be agreed upon in order to implement what have been approved by the national dialogue.
- b) Specify an implementation mechanism:
 1. Following up with entering referendum and electoral law to the parliament.
 2. Following up with the necessary constitutional and legal reform to what the national dialogue approves of.
 3. After the approval of this framework, wide discussions shall be held to address the political and parliamentary electoral reforms with respect to the subjects under the national dialogue, the parliamentary elections shall be conducted only after the referendum on these reforms.
