The bishop may be in the church's radio station, Voice of Hope. The radio station (La Voix de L'Esperance, FM 101.6) is on the same grounds as the bishop's residence and the church. The address is: Cocody, Cour du Temple Jubile', 01 BP 1282 Abidjan 01.
